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MC 1 - 14 & 15 September 2022 – Saarbrücken (Germany)

Item 1 – Official opening

- MC agreed to ringfence a provision of EUR 300,000 from the Programme reserve to cover for preparation costs of the new 28-34 Programme.
- MC exchanged on elements considered relevant to share at this stage regarding the general state of play in each Member State on 28-34 preparations.
