
From gravel and iron to sponge cities

Near Stuttgart's city centre lies a large ungrown area, used for decades for railway tracks and repair workshops. The area has the potential to become a "sponge city" in response to climate change and declining groundwater levels, but its industrial past left the soil contaminated.

This is where the RAINBOW project comes in, ensuring strict groundwater protection requirements are met as the area takes shape, allowing the Rosenstein quarter to become a lively community for 10 000 residents, with schools, sports and play areas, and numerous green spaces.
