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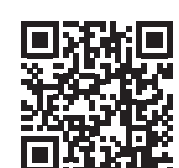
An innovative co-creative model for district heating

District Heating and Cooling (DHC) is a major tool for the energy transition of city neighbourhoods, featured in many local climate plans. However, there are economical barriers to developing grids.

The RODEO project breaks down these barriers by introducing a more participative business model that rebalances the costs, benefits and risks of developing DHC. The project validates this innovative co-creative model in four pilot cities across North-West Europe.
