Territoriality in Interreg North-West Europe

WHY IS TERRITORIALITY IMPORTANT?

The Interreg NWE Programme is a funding instrument of the European Union's Cohesion policy. As such, its aim is to **reduce social**, **economic and environmental disparities between regions** and ensure a balanced development across all territories.

The NWE Programme is therefore not just about what a project changes on a given topic, but also **where it achieves this change** in the North-West European area.

It's about how project results contribute to reducing territorial disparities between regions in one of the Programme's thematic objectives.

WHAT DOES THE PROGRAMME EXPECT?

NWE projects are expected to address a **transnational challenge** which is specifically relevant to the North-West European area.

In addressing this challenge, projects should have a placed-based approach.
This means:

- Identifying the specific territories in NWE that are concerned by the challenge
- Describing the characteristics of these territories
- Providing a rationale to their selection as areas of intervention for the project
